Large Formats = Better Cellaring Potential & Look Impressive

It is a known fact that wine from larger format wine bottles **age more slowly**, and possibly even **develop more complexity** and nuances than wines from smaller wine bottle sizes. This is due to the smaller amount of air (oxygen and sulphur dioxide) that resides between the cork and the wine. The surface to air leading to oxidation is greatly reduced.

Lafite 1975 (3L) - Ex-Chateau, Banded

Wine Advocate 92: "I have had some great bottles of the 1975 Lafite, most of them in the wine's first 15 years of life. Since then, I have seen wines that appeared cooked and stewed, with a Barolo tar-like aroma, as well as others with the classic Pauillac, lead-pencil, cedar, cassis, and tobacco aromatic dimension. The 1975 is a powerful Lafite, and troublesome bottles tend to reveal more tannin and funkiness than others, which have a roasted character, combined with a gravelly, mineral underpinning. As this wine has aged, it appears to be less of a sure bet. In most cases, it has been an outstanding wine, as the bottle tasted in December suggested. The aromatics indicate the wine is fully mature, but the tough tannin level clearly underscores the dark side of the 1975 vintage. This wine will undoubtedly last for another 30+ years, but I am not sure the fruit will hold. It is a perplexing wine that may still turn out to be an exceptional Lafite. In contrast, the 1976 has always been much more forward and consistent. However, I would still take the 1975 over the overrated, mediocre 1970, 1966, and 1961."

Hewitson Private Cellar Shiraz Mourvedre 2006 (1.5L)

Wine Advocate 93: "This wine is produced from Mourvedre vines planted in 1853, said to be the oldest Mourvedre vines in the world. It provides intense black cherry, black plum and damp loam aromas with nuances of tar, licorice, chocolate, Chinese dried plums and hung meat. Full bodied with a medium to firm level of finely grained tannins, it is richly fruited with a nice savory edge and a very long finish."

Wine Advocate 90: "Charcoal, espresso roast, blackcurrants and spice are all present in this medium-bodied, nicely concentrated, relatively evolved and precocious Haut-Bergey, which is just now attaining its plateau of maturity. Soft tannins and an attractive plushness are followed by a wine capable of drinking well for another decade or more."

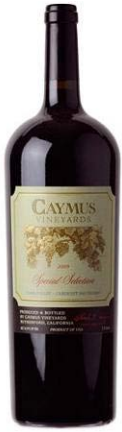

Wine Spectator 93: "There's curreant, spice, chocolate and berry character on the nose. Deep, complex and full-bodied, with chewy tannins and a long, flavorful finish. A solid wine. Chewy. Best after 2014."

Caymus Special Selection Cabernet Sauvignon 2012 (1.5L)

Wine Advocate 96: *"The 2012 Cabernet Sauvignon Special Selection has a dense blackish/purple color and creamy, sweet crème de cassis fruit, blackberries, a touch of graphite and vanilla, This exuberant, boisterous, in-your-face style of Cabernet Sauvignon is clearly a fruit bomb, so be warned. Full-bodied and opulent with stunning concentration and richness, the wine has no hard edges and is much in the Caymus style of terrific fruit intensity (most of it black and blue), voluptuous texture, and a stunning finish with plenty of glycerin, wood and spice. The alcohol on the label is listed at 14.8%, which seems about accurate. I have Caymus Special Selection in my cellar back to some of the historic wines made by Chuck Wagner's father in the early 1970s, and while the style's gotten more precocious and consumer-friendly, these wines, even the more latter-day styles, have a tendency to age beautifully. This can be drunk now, or cellared for 20+ years."*
